Restrooms: *Upper Level* – Through the door to the left of the altar (NW), past the chapel, past the library, and to the right of the church office.



Don't be anxious about anything; rather, bring up all of your requests to God in your prayers and petitions, along with giving thanks. BCP 358

“The Creeds are statements of our basic beliefs about God” (BCP 851).

We say these words as a gathered community to affirm our belief in God as creator, redeemer, and sustainer of all creation, as the source of life and holiness. God has blessed humanity with relationships and community which are part of God's own essence as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We do not say these words as some sort of litmus test but as an invitation to wrestle with the mystery and complexity of God with generations of Christians who have gone before us and with generations who will come after us.

*We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,

*They shall be like a tree planted by water,

The most important words to say in Church are “thank you.” Say it often, and mean it, and today I say it to you. Thank you for the many gifts that you share with our community.

You have heard the familiar expression “can’t see the forest for the trees” before. We most often use it to describe that occasion in which we lose sight of the big picture while focusing on the details. From my position, I often experience the blessing of being able to see the big picture of our congregation – the ministry we bring to our neighbors, the impact we have on our community, the ways that week after week we come together to celebrate our faith and praise God. This is the forest.

And I get to wander amongst the trees. From the small shoot reaching out from its seed and finding the sunlight, to the mightiest tree, standing tall, showing strength, offering sheltering love to those who need it. You are those trees, each drawing strength from God in Holy Communion and showering the world with the love and grace you have come to know here at Church of the Ascension. I am blessed in that here in our congregation, I can see both the forest and the trees!

When I walk through a forest, I am aware of the tangle of roots, how one tree is connected to another. Trees use these networks, secretly talking to each other through their roots, passing information along. Adult trees share their sugars with young saplings, a dying tree can send its remaining resources back out to help the community. These networks, these roots of abundance, keep trees in place just as much as they free them to grow and share.

The theme of our annual pledge campaign this year is Rooted in Abundance, and we are reminded that we are a mighty forest comprised of ancient trunks and sprightly saplings, each of us contributing our gifts to a world that needs us. As you hear the messages and stories of abundance this year, take note of how generosity spreads and widens our root structures of faith and action.

Betsy Bura (1923-2008) and Walter Bura (1919-2010)

Betsy Hamlen, a native of Massachusetts, married Ohio native, Walter Bura, on June 22, 1947.

Betsy L. Bura was known to everyone at Church of the Ascension for decades. She was known for her kind, thoughtful and giving personality. She used her gifts singing in the choir, serving for years on vestry and helping with a variety of fundraisers. Betsy was in several of the Women's Guilds and also involved with ECW. She enjoyed helping with the church's annual Bazaar and was invaluable with her efforts to raise money for the restoration and enhancement of our church's pipe organ.

- **The [Certification of Delegates](#) is an online form** that must be completed, signed, and submitted by the parish Clerk by **October 27** and is a canonical requirement to certify the elected lay individuals representing the parish. Please note that these are two separate forms and they must be completed by their respective deadlines.
- We are pleased to offer a **new app** for this year's Convention called Guidebook. To use the app, download the [Guidebook app](#), and search for dohio. Once downloaded, you will be able to view information such as the handbook, nominations, an interactive map, and flyers. We recommend downloading the app prior to the day of Convention.
- Continuing our commitment to sustainability and fiscal stewardship, the **convention handbook will be available on the diocesan website** in both PDF and EPUB formats by mid-October. Once available, the link will be emailed in the diocesan weekly email. A limited number of printed copies will be on each table at Convention. Those who prefer a paper copy are advised to print the handbook beforehand. The various sections of the handbook will be available individually on the website to easily allow printing by section/topic (for example: the budget, nominations, etc.). The handbook, as mentioned above, is also available on the app.
- **Lay pension reporting forms** are available now on the [diocesan website](#) in the Finance section. The canonical deadline for filing is **October 1** and is one of the parish compliance requirements for lay delegates to have voting privileges at Convention.
