The commandments, *Don't commit adultery, don't murder, don't steal, don't desire what others have,* and any other commandments, are all summed up in one word: *You must love your neighbor as yourself.* Love doesn't do anything wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is what fulfills the Law.

As you do all this, you know what time it is. The hour has already come for you to wake up from your sleep. Now our salvation is nearer than when we first had faith. The night is almost over, and the day is near. So let's get rid of the actions that belong to the darkness and put on the weapons of light. Let's behave appropriately as

people who live in the day, not in partying and getting drunk, not in sleeping around and obscene behavior, not in fighting and obsession. Instead, dress yourself with the Lord Jesus Christ, and don't plan to indulge your selfish desires.

BCP 358

"The Creeds are statements of our basic beliefs about God" (BCP 851).

We say these words as a gathered community to affirm our belief in God as creator, redeemer, and sustainer of all creation, as the source of life and holiness. God has blessed humanity with relationships and community which are part of God's own essence as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We do not say these words as some sort of litmus test but as an invitation to wrestle with the mystery and complexity of God with generations of Christians who have gone before us and with generations who will come after us.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father,
Who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified.
Who has spoken through the Prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Church

- Q. Why is the Church described as holy?
- A. The Church is holy, because the Holy Spirit dwells in it, consecrates its members, and guides them to do God's work.
- Q. Why is the Church described as catholic?
- A. The Church is catholic, because it proclaims the whole Faith to all people, to the end of time.
- Q. Why is the Church described as apostolic?
- A. The Church is apostolic, because it continues in the teaching and fellowship of the apostles and is sent to carry out Christ's mission to all people.
- Q. What is the mission of the Church?
- A. The mission of the Church is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ.
- Q. How does the Church pursue its mission?
- A. The Church pursues its mission as it prays and worships, proclaims the Gospel, and promotes justice, peace, and love.
- Q. Through whom does the Church carry out its mission?
- A. The Church carries out its mission through the ministry of all its members.

Sylvia Nolff Kleinsmith (1895-1979)

Sylvia N. Kleinsmith was the daughter of Katherine M. and George O. Kleinsmith. She grew up a few streets from Church of the Ascension on Beach Avenue. After attending Flora Stone Mather College of Western Reserve University (class of 1918), Sylvia entered the professional world as a teacher and later principal, enjoying years of work at Madison, Taft, Franklin and Garfield Elementary next to the Church of Ascension. At Ascension she was a member of ECW (Episcopal Church Women). Outside of church, Sylvia was known to be on the boards of many organizations, including the Lakewood Historical Society, Mather College, the Great Lakes Shakespeare Festival and the advisory committee of the Lakewood Hospital Practical Nurses School. Sylvia N. Kleinsmith donated the stained glass window The Carpenter Shop (found in the balcony) in memory of her parents, Katherine M. and George O Kleinsmith, who also attended and were active at Ascension for years.

The windows found in the nave of the church were created in Boston in the 1940s and 50s by Reynolds, Francis and Rohnstock.
