The Nicene Creed BCP 358

"The Creeds are statements of our basic beliefs about God" (BCP 851).

We say these words as a gathered community to affirm our belief in God as creator, redeemer, and sustainer of all creation, as the source of life and holiness. God has blessed humanity with relationships and community which are part of God's own essence as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We do not say these words as some sort of litmus test but as an invitation to wrestle with the mystery and complexity of God with generations of Christians who have gone before us and with generations who will come after us.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father,
Who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified.
Who has spoken through the Prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

- Q. What is the Church?
- A. The Church is the community of the New Covenant.
- Q. How is the Church described in the Bible?
- A. The Church is described as the Body of which Jesus Christ is the Head and of which all baptized persons are members. It is called the People of God, the New Israel, a holy nation, a royal priesthood, and the pillar and ground of truth.
- Q. How is the Church described in the creeds?
- A. The Church is described as one, holy, catholic, and apostolic.
- Q. Why is the Church described as one?
- A. The Church is one, because it is one Body, under one Head, our Lord Jesus Christ.
- Q. Why is the Church described as holy?
- A. The Church is holy, because the Holy Spirit dwells in it, consecrates its members, and guides them to do God's work.
- Q. Why is the Church described as catholic?
- A. The Church is catholic, because it proclaims the whole Faith to all people, to the end of time.
- Q. Why is the Church described as apostolic?
- A. The Church is apostolic, because it continues in the teaching and fellowship of the apostles and is sent to carry out Christ's mission to all people.
- Q. What is the mission of the Church?
- A. The mission of the Church is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ.
- Q. How does the Church pursue its mission?
- A. The Church pursues its mission as it prays and worships, proclaims the Gospel, and promotes justice, peace, and love.
- Q. Through whom does the Church carry out its mission?
- A. The Church carries out its mission through the ministry of all its members.

Lillia Wilhelmina Hofheins Meckel (1868- 1947) and Frank Alexander Meckel (1866- 1938)

A native of Cincinnati, Frank Meckel and his brothers came to the Cleveland area in 1870. He and his two brothers learned the trade of piano building and later created The Meckel Bros., a well-known piano and instrument company. Frank invited Lillia Hofheins, a young woman with a beautiful voice, to sing at Linwood Park in Vermillion, Ohio where several people would enjoy summer months together in a religious and musical community. After this encounter, Frank Meckel courted the Buffalo native. Frank Meckel and Lillia Hofheins married on May 14, 1890 in Buffalo, NY. Together they had five children: Elsa, Frank, Gertrude, Walter and Ralph. In 1903, the Meckel family built a home on Clarence Avenue, which boasted a large pipe organ on a grand landing of a suspended staircase.

Their children were all confirmed at Ascension: Elsa (April 16, 1908), Frank (March 26, 1911), Gertrude (April 14, 1918), Walter and his mother Lillia (May 1, 1919) and Ralph (May 15, 1932). Frank Meckel is found in 1909 as a member of vestry. Unfortunately, we do not have the minutes for vestry from 1875 to 1909 so it is possible that his involvement with vestry was even before. On vestry, Frank Meckel

used his knowledge of organs, pianos and music as he represented the music committee. Lillia Meckel and Frank were part of the choirs at Ascension and are often found in records showing their musical gifts being used at services and at musical fundraisers for the church. On August 18, 1924, their daughter Gertrude married Donald Spencer Connelly at Church of the Ascension with Rev. Wallace Gordon performing the service. Frank Meckel passed away and his burial services were performed by Rev. Studwell on November 30, 1938. Lillia W. Meckel passed away almost a decade later. Her funeral services were performed by Rev. Pattie on April 7, 1947. Their eldest child was Elsa Marie Meckel, whose fiancé died tragically in an explosion at Clinic Hospital in Cleveland in 1929. Elsa was very involved with Church of the Ascension, teaching Sunday School, helping with a variety of events with ECW and altar guild. It is because of the generosity of the Meckel family that our church now has in our archives many scrapbooks, pictures and documents from Elsa's estate.
