A Reading from Acts

The apostles and the brothers and sisters throughout Judea heard that even the Gentiles had welcomed God's word. When Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him. They accused him, "You went into the home of the uncircumcised and ate with them!"

Step-by-step, Peter explained what had happened. "I was in the city of Joppa praving when I had a visionary experience. In my vision, I saw something like a large linen sheet being lowered from heaven by its four corners. It came all the way down to me. As I stared at it, wondering what it was, I saw four-legged animals-including wild beasts—as well as reptiles and wild birds. I heard a voice say, 'Get up, Peter! Kill and eat!' I responded, 'Absolutely not, Lord! Nothing impure or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' The voice from heaven spoke a second time, 'Never consider unclean what God has made pure.' This happened three times, then everything was pulled back into heaven. At that moment three men who had been sent to me from Caesarea arrived at the house where we were staying. The Spirit told me to go with them even though they were Gentiles. These six brothers also went with me, and we entered that man's house. He reported to us how he had seen an angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and summon Simon, who is known as Peter. He will tell you how you and your entire household can be saved.' When I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell on them, just as the Spirit fell on us in the beginning. I remembered the Lord's words: 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If God gave them the same gift he gave us who believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, then who am I? Could I stand in God's way?"

Once the apostles and other believers heard this, they calmed down. They praised God and concluded, "So then God has enabled Gentiles to change their hearts and lives so that they might have new life."

"When you heard the wonder of the Word I was there to cheer you on; You were raised to praise the living Lord, to whom you now belong. If you find someone to share your time and you join your hearts as one, I'll be there to make your verses rhyme from dusk 'till rising sun."

The Presider asks the following questions of the candidates who can speak for themselves, and of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children

Answer	I renounce them.
Question	Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?
Answer	I renounce them.
Question	Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Question	Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?
Answer	I do.
Question	Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?
Answer	I do.
Question	Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?
Answer	I do.

The Presider addresses the congregation, saying

Presider Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support *These persons* in *their* life in Christ?

People We will.

Presider Let us join with *those* who *are* committing *themselves* to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Presider touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. *Amen*.

The Baptism

Each candidate is presented by name to the Presider, who then pours water upon the candidate, saying

Patricia, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

Harper, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

When this action has been completed for all candidates, the Priest, at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over them, saying

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon *these* your *servants* the forgiveness of sin, and have raised *them* to the new life of grace. Sustain *them*, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give *them* an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen*.

Then the Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross using Chrism and saying to each one,

Patricia, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism
and marked as Christ's own for ever. Amen.
Harper, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism
and marked as Christ's own for ever. Amen.

Godparent(s):	I will with God's help
Godparent(s):	Harper, receive the light of Christ
Congregation: Thanks be to God

Remembering Past Parishioners Celebrating 150 years of ministry 1875 – 2025



Helen Dorothea Colgrove (1896-1949) Henry George Salisbury (1893-1970)

Henry Salisbury was born October 10, 1893, in Bristol, England, son of Albert and Bessie Handy Salisbury. He was the eldest child and was baptized by Rev. W. S. Hooton on November 5, 1893, at Holy Trinity Church in Clifton, Bristol, England in an Anglican Church. As a young man, he worked as an assistant grocer before he served his country in the Great War or World War I. He was in the Queen's Own Oxfordshire Hussars and fought in France. In 1921, after the war, he decided to move to America. He met and married Helen Dorothea Colgrove in York, Ontario, Canada on August 28, 1926. Not long after their wedding, they moved to the United States, where Harry later became a salesman for Salada Tea, a Canadian tea company. Helen was the eldest child of Charles and Margaret Webster Colgrove. She was born on February 26, 1896, in London, Ontario, Canada. As a single woman, Helen worked as a bookkeeper before marrying Henry Salisbury at the age of 31. Together they had three sons: Donald, John and Richard.

At Church of the Ascension, the Salisbury family was a very involved and connected family historically. Helen Salisbury, having three boys of her own, made her perfectly equipped to teach the third-grade boys' class at church. She was also in ECW and the Ashton Thompson Guild. On April 12, 1941, John and Richard Salisbury were baptized at Church of the Ascension by Rev. John R. Pattie. Helen and her two sons: John and Donald, were confirmed at Ascension on May 17, 1942. Their son Richard was confirmed on May 9, 1948. They all were confirmed by Bishop Beverley Tucker, presented by Rev. John R. Pattie. Harry Salisbury was on vestry in the 1940s and also took responsibility for the well-known boys' choir at Ascension, where all three of his sons sang. On August 30, 1949, Helen Colgrove Salisbury passed away. Her funeral service was officiated by Dr. Stuart Cole. In memory of his wife, Harry gave the window David. Two of their sons were married at Church of the Ascension. Their eldest son, Donald, married Dorothy Olivia Theurer (daughter of Dorothy and Raible Theurer- an Ascension family) on December 12, 1953. On June 18, 1955, their son John married Dorie Wright (daughter of Clarence and Amy Wright- an Ascension family). Many of the Salisbury grandchildren were baptized at Church of the Ascension and his son John was later on vestry like his father, Harry. On May 11, 1970, Harry George Salisbury passed away and his funeral services were performed by Rev. Braun. Helen and Henry Salisbury are buried at Sunset Memorial Park in North Olmsted, Ohio.
