A Reading from Hebrews

11:29-12:2

By faith they crossed the Red Sea as if they were on dry land, but when the Egyptians tried it, they were drowned.

By faith Jericho's walls fell after the people marched around them for seven days.

By faith Rahab the prostitute wasn't killed with the disobedient because she welcomed the spies in peace.

What more can I say? I would run out of time if I told you about Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel, and the prophets. Through faith they conquered kingdoms, brought about justice, realized promises, shut the mouths of lions, put out raging fires, escaped from the edge of the sword, found strength in weakness, were mighty in war, and routed foreign armies. Women received back their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured and refused to be released so they could gain a better resurrection.

But others experienced public shame by being taunted and whipped; they were even put in chains and in prison. They were stoned to death, they were cut in two, and they died by being murdered with swords. They went around wearing the skins of sheep and goats, needy, oppressed, and mistreated. The world didn't deserve them. They wandered around in deserts, mountains, caves, and holes in the ground.

All these people didn't receive what was promised, though they were given approval for their faith. God provided something better for us so they wouldn't be made perfect without us.

So then, with endurance, let's also run the race that is laid out in front of us, since we have such a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us. Let's throw off any extra baggage, get rid of the sin that trips us up, and fix our eyes on Jesus, faith's pioneer and perfecter. He endured the cross, ignoring the shame, for the sake of the joy that was laid out in front of him, and sat down at the right side of God's throne.

The Nicene Creed BCP 358

"The Creeds are statements of our basic beliefs about God" (BCP 851).

We say these words as a gathered community to affirm our belief in God as creator, redeemer, and sustainer of all creation, as the source of life and holiness. God has blessed humanity with relationships and community which are part of God's own essence as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We do not say these words as some sort of litmus test but as an invitation to wrestle with the mystery and complexity of God with generations of Christians who have gone before us and with generations who will come after us.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,

the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father,
Who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified.
Who has spoken through the Prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

Remembering Past Parishioners Celebrating 150 years of ministry 1875 – 2025



Joyce Edna Drusilla Hulbert Heidmann (1926- 2005) Herbert Arend Heidmann (1925-2013)

Herbert Heidmann was the son of German immigrants, Arend and Ida Heidmann. He was born on November 19, 1925, in New York. As an infant, he and his family are found in records as passengers on a ship on his first trip to Germany. It would not be his last. Known as "Herb", he enlisted in the Army to serve his country during World War II. He was sent to Europe and ended up in Germany.

Joyce Hulbert was born June 28, 1926, in Gloucestershire, England. She was an orphan, known for her striking, red hair. As a result of World War II, Joyce was a secretary for the Allied Forces and working in a building in Germany. As Joyce worked at her desk, a young American soldier walked by and greeted her with "Hey Red!" Joyce was not impressed or complimented. This soldier later learned that his comment was not appreciated, apologized and took Joyce out to make amends. This would be the beginning of a loving relationship for Joyce and Herb Heidmann.

They married in Heidelberg, Germany and later Herb was stationed in Korea, California and Alaska. After twenty-three years serving in the Army, Herb Heidemann's time in the Army was over. They later settled in West Virginia, where their son, John, was born.

Joyce and Herb became active at Church of the Ascension, where as a family they were involved with virtually every aspect of the parish. Their son John was confirmed on October 15, 1978, by Bishop Burt and presented by Rev. Braun. John was also an acolyte. Herb Heidmann served many terms on vestry. He was part of the choir for a very short time and then became an usher. He was also part of the Men's Group at Ascension.

Joyce was part of the Morning and Afternoon Guilds. She was a member of ECW and for a while its President. She was an active part of the choir at Ascension and during the great renovations of the pipe organ, lent her personal organ to be used during services. With any activity or fundraiser, Joyce was there to support and help.

Joyce Heidmann passed away on New Year's Eve 2005. Her service was at Church of the Ascension on January 5, 2006, and was officiated by Father W. Lee Dominick. After the death of his wife, Herb Heidmann turned to his parish for love and support. He was often found visiting Church of the Ascension throughout the week for comfort. With time he required more help and moved to live closer to his son. Herbert A. Heidmann passed away on January 13, 2013. His memorial service was at Church of the Ascension on January 26, 2013, which was officiated by Rev. Elaine McCoy. Herb and Joyce were both cremated and their ashes are together in the columbarium in the chapel at Church of the Ascension.
