BCP 358

"The Creeds are statements of our basic beliefs about God" (BCP 851).

We say these words as a gathered community to affirm our belief in God as creator, redeemer, and sustainer of all creation, as the source of life and holiness. God has blessed humanity with relationships and community which are part of God's own essence as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We do not say these words as some sort of litmus test but as an invitation to wrestle with the mystery and complexity of God with generations of Christians who have gone before us and with generations who will come after us.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father,
Who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified.
Who has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.



Remembering Past Parishioners Celebrating 150 years of ministry 1875 – 2025





William Henry Chappel (1874-1943) Julia Anna Hood (1879-1966)

William Henry Chappel was born on February 8, 1874, in Stormont, Canada to Hiram and Marion Anderson Chappel. The Chappel family were farmers. Canadian records indicate that the Chappel family belonged to the Church of England. After the turn of the century, William H. Chappel, who was a professional hockey player in Toronto, Canada, came to Cleveland, Ohio and captained one of the first teams to play in the Elysium.

Julia A. Hood was born September 28, 1879, in Toronto, Ohio (near Steubenville, Ohio) to Thomas and Margaret Myers Hood. The Hood family was Methodist. Her father, a veteran of the Civil War, worked as a ceramic tile maker.

Julia and William married on April 15, 1914, at St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Cleveland. In 1920, the Chappel family was found living at 1490 Grace Avenue, which is within walking distance to Church of the

Ascension. Together Julia and William had two children: William Henry Chappel Jr. and Margaret Marion Chappel. Their son and daughter were baptized at Church of the Ascension on April 3, 1920, by Rev. Wallace Gordon. Julia Hood Chappel was confirmed as an adult on May 9, 1926, by Bishop Leonard and presented by Rev. Gordon. William H. Chappel Jr. was confirmed April 21, 1929, by Bishop Rogers and presented by Rev. Gordon. Margaret Marion Chappel was confirmed on April 30, 1933, by Bishop Rogers and presented by Rev. Studwell.

Their daughter, Margaret Marion Chappel, married Malcolm John Lang on July 15, 1942, at Church of the Ascension and Rev. John R. Pattie officiated. They both were active at Church of the Ascension with Malcolm Lang serving on vestry for many years including terms as Junior and Senior Warden.

William H. Chappel Sr. was a salesman and jobber of automobile accessories. He would buy goods in quantity from manufactures and then sell to dealers. At Church of the Ascension, William H. Chappel was on vestry. His first term was in 1929 and his last was in 1942.

On May 25, 1943, William Henry Chappel Sr. passed away. His burial was at Church of the Ascension on May 27, 1943, and officiated by Rev. John R. Pattie. In memory of her husband, Julia Chappel donated the window *Amos*.

After the death of her husband, Julia Chappel continued to be active at Ascension. She was at one time head of the Ladies' Guild and on a committee to help the vestry with fundraising. She was known as a strong leader, who was talented at motivating people to work as a team. When Rev. Gordon left Ascension, she was head of a group that wanted to raise money to give as a farewell gift.

Julia Hood Chappel passed away on March 9, 1966, and her funeral services at Church of the Ascension were on March 11, 1966, officiated by Dr. Stuart Cole. Julia and William Chappel were buried at Lakewood Park Cemetery in Rocky River.

- Q. Why is the Church described as apostolic?
- A. The Church is apostolic, because it continues in the teaching and fellowship of the apostles and is sent to carry out Christ's mission to all people.
- Q. What is the mission of the Church?
- A. The mission of the Church is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ.
- Q. How does the Church pursue its mission?
- A. The Church pursues its mission as it prays and worships, proclaims the Gospel, and promotes justice, peace, and love.
- Q. Through whom does the Church carry out its mission?
- A. The Church carries out its mission through the ministry of all its members
