Brothers and sisters, we have a request for you concerning our Lord Jesus Christ's coming and when we are gathered together to be with him. We don't want you to be easily confused in your mind or upset if you hear that the day of the Lord is already here, whether you hear it through some spirit, a message, or a letter supposedly from us. Don't let anyone deceive you in any way. That day won't come unless the rebellion comes first and the person who is lawless is revealed, who is headed for destruction. He is the opponent of every so-called god or object of worship and promotes himself over them. So he sits in God's temple, displaying himself to show that he is God. You remember that I used to tell you these things while I was with you, don't you?

But we always must thank God for you, brothers and sisters who are loved by God. This is because he chose you from the beginning to be the first crop of the harvest. This brought salvation, through your dedication to God by the Spirit and through your belief in the truth. God called all of you through our good news so you could possess the honor of our Lord Jesus Christ. So then, brothers and sisters, stand firm and hold on to the traditions we taught you, whether we taught you in person or through our letter. Our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father loved us and through grace gave us eternal comfort and a good hope. May he encourage your hearts and give you strength in every good thing you do or say.

Some Sadducees, who deny that there's a resurrection, came to Jesus and asked, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that *if a man's brother dies* leaving a widow *but no children, the brother must marry the widow and raise up children for his brother*. Now there were seven brothers. The first man married a woman and then died childless. The second and then the third brother married her. Eventually all seven married her, and they all died without leaving any children. Finally, the woman died too. In the resurrection, whose wife will she be? All seven were married to her."

Jesus said to them, "People who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage. But those who are considered worthy to participate in that age, that is, in the age of the resurrection from the dead, won't marry nor will they be given in marriage. They can no longer die, because they are like angels and are God's children since they share in the resurrection. Even Moses demonstrated that the dead are raised—in the passage about the burning bush, when he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of

Jacob. He isn't the God of the dead but of the living. To him they are all alive."

"The Creeds are statements of our basic beliefs about God" (BCP 851).

We say these words as a gathered community to affirm our belief in God as creator, redeemer, and sustainer of all creation, as the source of life and holiness. God has blessed humanity with relationships and community which are part of God's own essence as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We do not say these words as some sort of litmus test but as an invitation to wrestle with the mystery

and complexity of God with generations of Christians who have gone before us and with generations who will come after us.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

Remembering Past Parishioners Celebrating 150 years of ministry 1875 – 2025





Martha Ann Smith Hartman (1932-2023)

Martha Ann Smith was born February 16, 1932, to J. Donald Smith and Helen Roche Smith. Martha grew up in Lakewood and attended Lakewood City Schools, including Taft Elementary School, Emerson Middle School and Lakewood High School. She was the eldest child of six children, including a set of twin brothers and a set of twin sisters.

After graduation from Lakewood High School in 1950, Martha attended Ohio University for one year. Although Martha grew up in the Christian Science faith, she was a bridesmaid at the wedding of Dorisann Wright and John Salisbury in 1955 at Church of the Ascension. She was greatly impressed with the church and the congregation. Not long afterwards, Martha and her sisters became part of the Ascension community. Her sisters Ellen Ruth and Catherine Sue, who were twins, were confirmed on November 25, 1956. Martha was confirmed on December 18, 1960, and was presented by Dr. Stuart Cole. Martha at this point had taken on the responsibility and care of her younger siblings after the death of

her mother. Many personal sacrifices were made to help her siblings and provide them with nurturing equal to that of a parent.

On December 30, 1975, Martha Smith married Frederick Hartman, a man she knew from her youth at Lakewood High School. He was known as a football star in his earlier days. Although they never had children together, Martha was a caring and nurturing woman who enjoyed helping with Sunday School at Church of the Ascension, especially in the nursery with the babies and toddlers. At church, she was part of ECW and known to roll-up her sleeves to help with any project, fundraiser or work in which the congregation was involved. She helped with the annual Christmas Bazaar and Rummage Sales. She is also remembered for the hours she gave making crosses for Palm Sundays. With her gentle and kind nature, Martha helped with all projects but never felt the need to have a title or leadership role.

On September 22, 2005, Frederick W. Hartman passed away. His burial service was performed by Father Lee Domenic at Lakewood Park Cemetery. After the death of her husband, Martha continued to be dedicated to Church of the Ascension, where she worked and helped. Her attendance at the church was only stopped because of her declining health. Martha Ann Smith Hartman passed away on September 20, 2023, at the age of 91. She was buried with her husband at Lakewood Park Cemetery.

The Language of Song is Universal

An Interview By the Very Rev. Julia McCray Goldsmith

I'm classically trained in opera and in church music, so when I think of "tell out my soul" I am reminded that music is a universal language. I only speak English fluently, but I sing in other languages. I can do this because I've learned to interpret the universal feelings in the music—love or loss or longing—that the composer intended. When I sing, I'm telling out on their behalf.

Last Saturday I was singing Andrew Lloyd Webber's "Pie Jesu." One way to translate these words, in the context of a requiem, is "Lord give them rest." It left me thinking of trans people and immigrants and others whose identity is currently under attack, and I find myself praying for their rest in Jesus.

I was not raised in The Episcopal Church, so I'm relatively new to the hymnody. But I convened our cathedral's young adult ministry and now I am on the vestry. I seem to get called to leadership roles even when I'm not looking for them. Maybe because I stand up for others? I was raised as a girl and taught to be more quiet and passive, but as a non-binary adult I lead out loud and assertively. It's a common understanding in music circles that the skill of your choir is only as good as the worst voice. Everyone is diminished if we don't support each other's voices.

I am especially thankful for the voices and the teachers that have supported me along the way. My first church music director believed in and encouraged me when I was only nine or ten. I had great college music professors and church music directors at St. Bartholomew's in Poway and at Trinity Cathedral in San Jose. These people told me that I have a gift to share, and I believed them. **\overline{\text{W}}.org
