The people sit.

Whatever was written in the past was written for our instruction so that we could have hope through endurance and through the encouragement of the scriptures. May the God of endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude toward each other, similar to Christ Jesus' attitude. That way you can glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ together with one voice.

So welcome each other, in the same way that Christ also welcomed you, for God's glory. I'm saying that Christ became a servant of those who are circumcised for the sake of God's truth, in order to confirm the promises given to the ancestors, and so that the Gentiles could glorify God for his mercy. As it is written,

Because of this I will confess you among the Gentiles, and I will sing praises to your name.

And again, it says,

Rejoice, Gentiles, with his people.

And again,

Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and all the people should sing his praises.

And again, Isaiah says,

There will be a root of Jesse, who will also rise to rule the Gentiles. The Gentiles will place their hope in him.

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in faith so that you overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

People from Jerusalem, throughout Judea, and all around the Jordan River came to him. As they confessed their sins, he baptized them in the Jordan River. Many Pharisees and Sadducees came to be baptized by John. He said to them, "You children of snakes! Who warned you to escape from the angry judgment that is coming soon? Produce fruit that shows you have changed your hearts and lives. And don't even think about saying to yourselves, Abraham is our father. I tell you that God is able to raise up Abraham's children from these stones. The ax is already at the root of the trees. Therefore, every tree that doesn't produce good fruit will be chopped down and tossed into the fire. I baptize with water those of you who have changed your hearts and lives. The one who is coming after me is stronger than I am. I'm not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. The shovel he uses to sift the wheat from the husks is in his hands. He will clean out his threshing area and bring the wheat into his barn. But he will burn the husks with a fire that can't be put out."

The Nicene Creed BCP 358

"The Creeds are statements of our basic beliefs about God" (BCP 851).

We say these words as a gathered community to affirm our belief in God as creator, redeemer, and sustainer of all creation, as the source of life and holiness. God has blessed humanity with relationships and community which are part of God's own essence as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We do not say these words as some sort of litmus test but as an invitation to wrestle with the mystery and complexity of God with generations of Christians who have gone before us and with generations who will come after us.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father,
Who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified.
Who has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Remembering Past Parishioners Celebrating 150 years of ministry 1875 – 2025



Harold Edward Braun (1915-2002) Velma Mae Beal Braun (1918-1996)

Harold was born on August 30, 1915, in Dover, Ohio. He was the son of Edward and Antionette Wagner Braun. His parents were Russian born, German-speaking immigrants. He went to public schools in Dover and graduated in 1933 from Dover High School. He enjoyed sports and played on the basketball team, which played in the State Championship. After high school, Harold Braun studied at Muskingum College, where he enjoyed being in orchestra, band and playing basketball and running cross country. He also excelled in ministerial groups on campus.

It was at Muskingum College that Harold Braun and another student became acquainted. Velma Mae Beal was studying to be an English and Home Economics teacher. Harold E. Braun married Velma M. Beal on May 28, 1942, in Guernsey, Ohio. Together they had three children: Christine, Douglas and Constance.

Harold became a Methodist minister and served as such for ten years in Brunswick, Ohio. During World War II, Harold Braun served his country in the Navy as a chaplain on the General Howe in the South Pacific.

In December 1953, he was ordained a deacon of the Episcopal Church and the following year ordained to the priesthood in June 1954. In July 1955, he completed two years as a curate of St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Lakewood, Ohio and was then named rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Oregon, Ohio. In 1968, Rev. Braun was called to return to Lakewood, Ohio but this time to Church of the Ascension. He began work at Ascension on September 15, 1968.

During his time at Ascension, there were many changes. Rev. Braun made it clear from the beginning that he ran a tight ship and was a strong leader. Not everyone adjusted to the changes easily. The organist and Christian Educator both left during his early time. Our first female on vestry, Barb Fludine, was welcomed to vestry one year after Braun arrived in Lakewood and just a few years later our first female as Senior Warden, Mary Lindenstruth, was elected. In 1976, women finally had the right to become clergy, which was actually upsetting to some parishioners. Throughout his time at Ascension and no matter what the financial issue might be, Rev. Braun had a wonderful talent of helping people in the community open their hearts, minds and wallets for the church. He was an outgoing and fun character, known to enjoy a drink and smoke his pipe with the men of the church, as well as golf or bowling.

Velma Braun took the position as minister's wife to heart. She sat in the front pew every Sunday and was there to help in any and every way. She was known to play the organ and piano at services if needed. She would cook holiday meals for parishioners who might not have family with whom to celebrate. She was known to keep the kitchen and washrooms of the church spotless, simply because she felt it was the right thing to do. When their daughter Constance (known as Connie), married at Church of the Ascension, Velma Braun demonstrated her powers of multitasking. She sewed not only the wedding dress for her daughter but also all of the dresses for the bride's maids.

Around the time of his retirement, a group of parishioners made donations for the large stained-glass window, which is now found above the altar. It was then that the rood beam was moved so as not to block the beauty of the new window. In the summer of 1987, the church said goodbye to the Brauns when Rev. Braun retired. After retirement from Church of the Ascension, Rev. Braun served as interim director in Gates Mills, Ohio and Belleville, Ohio. Rev. Braun dedicated fifty years of service to the Episcopal Church.

Velma passed away on September 18, 1996. Rev. Harold Braun died on April 8, 2002. They are buried in Fort Meigs Cemetery in Perrysburg, Ohio. On June 8, 2014, needlepoint kneelers that parishioners from Church of the Ascension spent time, energy and resources creating, were installed and dedicated in memory of Velma Beal Braun. Her loving, Christian, and forgiving nature was and is still remembered by many parishioners at our church.
