Christ the King marks the end of the liturgical year, and our new beginning is underway. As we wound down the year, we said goodbye to our beloved Fr. Vincent Black, who will remain in a special place in our hearts. As the new liturgical year opens, we will be going through the process to call a new priest. This process will no doubt be challenging, exciting, and not without bumps, but we will come together as a community to find the right candidate. We haven't yet, but by this printing the vestry will have met with Canon Jesse Dodson (Canon to the Ordinary and our diocesan contact for clergy transition) to open this fledgling process.

We're starting in January with Alex DeJesus, and will follow with Kiera Dodd in February (both members of Vestry). #### John Russell Pattie (1903-1961) Alice Margaret Young (1903-1991)

John Russell Pattie was born on April 25, 1903 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania to Dr. John Pattie and Helen Pattie. His father was a Scottish-born dentist, who moved his practice to Akron, Ohio.

John Pattie attended public schools in Akron and then studied at Kenyon College, where he graduated in 1927. He then graduated in 1930 from Bexley Hall in Gambier, Ohio.

On May 26, 1931, John R. Pattie married Alice Margaret Young, a graduate of Miami University. Together they had three children: Mary Alice, Jane and John.

As a young minister, he was first an assistant in Trinity Church in Alliance, Ohio and then rector of Christ Episcopal Church of Warren until he was called to Church of the Ascension after the untimely death of Rev. Studwell. Rev. Pattie began his rectorship at Church of the Ascension on July 1, 1940.

The years the Pattie family had at Ascension were marked with great joys and sorrow. During World War II, the church sent their young men and women overseas to serve and many parishioners lost their lives. Our parish records show the burials of many who served their country. In general church attendance and faith during those years grew. The community looked to the church leaders for guidance, stability, and compassion. Many wartime weddings were held in the chapel of the church with brides in relatively simple suits compared to later gowns. After the war, many elaborate weddings occurred, which were described in great detail in society pages.

Pattie was known for inviting parishioners to his family farm, where families would picnic, share food, and enjoy the church community. Rev. Pattie left Church of the Ascension in January of 1949. He became rector at St. Christopher's by the River, Gates Mills. While there, he was awarded an honorary doctor-of-divinity from Kenyon College.

On October 1 1961, Rev. Pattie and Alice left America for an exchange experience in Alsager, England. They planned to be in England until the following March. During a walk in Alsager, Rev. Pattie passed away on December 19, 1961 at the age of 58. On January 3, 1962, Bishop Burroughs and retired Bishop Tucker conducted a memorial service for Rev. Pattie at St. Christopher's-by-the-River. After the loss of her husband, Alice Margaret Pattie moved to New York and co-authored a book entitled "Up from Grief." She was also a director of a group called Tower League, which was a ministry to older parishioners. She was considered a pioneer in a field many churches and ministers were reluctant to touch. She encouraged frank and honest discussions of death and grieving. Alice Margaret Young Pattie passed away on December 5, 1991. Alice and Rev. John Pattie are buried at the Kenyon College Cemetery in Gambier, Ohio.

#### Rev. Stuart Gottlieb Cole (1902 - 1987) Doris Mary Lyons Cole (1905 - 1973)

Stuart G. Cole was born on November 21, 1902 in Elmira New York to Frank and Rose Cole. He was baptized and confirmed in Trinity Episcopal Church in Elmira, where he served as a choirboy and acolyte. He later studied at and was a graduate of Hobart College in 1925 and later earned a bachelor of divinity degree from Kenyon College in 1928. The same year he was ordained a Deacon in Elmira, NY on April 11, 1928 and served as a curate at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Syracuse, NY and at the same time was also a priest in charge of two other parishes in two nearby towns.

On July 14, 1930, Rev. Stuart Cole married Doris Mary Lyons in St. Stephen's Church in Rochester, New York. Together they had two sons: Stuart Hadley and David Charles. In 1932 he answered a call to be rector of Trinity Episcopal Church in Seneca Falls, New York. In 1939 he was called to serve as Chaplain and Director of Guidance for Hobart and William Smith Colleges. He was also an assistant professor of philosophy and religion, coach of the freshman lacrosse team and. During his time there with the outbreak of World War II, he became Chaplain and counselor for the U. S. Navy V-12 officer-training program on the campus.

In December of 1944, he became the rector of Church of the Ascension in Rochester, NY until he became rector of Church of the Ascension in Lakewood, Ohio in 1949. Two years after Rev. Cole and his family came to Lakewood, a major renovation of the front of the church occurred. It was during this time that the large Rose window was placed on the front of the church and not long after the stained-glass windows on the main floor were installed. He remained in Lakewood for 20 years. During his time in Lakewood, he was recognized for his devotion and work in Ohio and New York when in 1954 he was awarded two honorary degrees. He was awarded a Doctor of Sacred Theology from Hobart College and a Doctor of Divinity from Kenyon College. From then on, he was known as Dr. Cole by all at Church of the Ascension. The same year (1954), Ascension Hall was built over the gymnasium.

Dr. Cole was known for his extreme devotion to the parish, being available daily and at any time. He was known for his sermons that connected Scripture and related it to real life. He was an out-going personality, who could preach a moving service but also could deliver a very worldly joke. Cards, drinks and cigars were all common staples for the vestrymen especially when they traveled together.

On May 16, 1964, Dr. Cole presided over the wedding of his son, David, who married at Church of the Ascension. After serving Church of the Ascension since 1949, Dr. Cole retired on June 30, 1968. He was remembered by so many parishioners as being as close to perfection as they could remember.

Dr. Cole and his wife moved to Bay Village after retirement. Doris passed away on February 4, 1973. After the death of his wife, Dr. Cole moved to California to be closer to his children and grandchildren. Dr. Stuart Cole passed away on March 13, 1987 in Alhambra, California. Dr. Stuart G. Cole and Doris were buried in Maple Grove Cemetery in Horseheads, New York.

#### Harold Edward Braun (1915-2002) Velma Mae Beal Braun (1918-1996)

Harold was born on August 30, 1915 in Dover, Ohio. He was the son of Edward and Antionette Wagner Braun. His parents were Russian born, German-speaking immigrants. He went to public schools in Dover and graduated in 1933 from Dover High School. He enjoyed sports and played on the basketball team, which played in the State Championship. After high school, Harold Braun studied at Muskingum College, where he enjoyed being in orchestra, band and playing basketball and running cross country. He also excelled in ministerial groups on campus.

It was at Muskingum College that Harold Braun and another student became acquainted. Velma Mae Beal was studying to be an English and Home Economics teacher. Harold E. Braun married Velma M. Beal on May 28, 1942 in Guernsey, Ohio. Together they had three children: Christine, Douglas and Constance.

Harold became a Methodist minister and served as such for ten years in Brunswick, Ohio. During World War II, Harold Braun served his country in the Navy as a chaplain on the General Howe in the South Pacific.

In December 1953, he was ordained a deacon of the Episcopal Church and the following year ordained to the priesthood in June 1954. In July 1955, he completed two years as a curate of St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Lakewood, Ohio and was then named rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Oregon, Ohio. In 1968, Rev. Braun was called to return to Lakewood, Ohio but this time to Church of the Ascension. He began work at Ascension on September 15, 1968.

During his time at Ascension, there were many changes. Rev. Braun made it clear from the beginning that he ran a tight ship and was a strong leader. Not everyone adjusted to the changes easily. The organist and Christian Educator both left during his early time. Our first female on vestry, Barb Fludine, happened one year after he arrived in Lakewood and just a few years later our first female as Senior Warden, Mary Lindenstruth, occurred. In 1976, women finally had the right to become clergy, which actually upset some parishioners. Throughout his time at Ascension and no matter what the financial issue might be, Rev. Braun had a wonderful talent of helping people in the community open their hearts, minds and wallets for the church. He was an outgoing and fun character, known to enjoy a drink and smoke his pipe with the men of the church, as well as golf or bowling.

Velma Braun took the position as minister's wife to heart. She sat in the front pew every Sunday and was there to help in any and every way. She was known to play the organ and piano at services if needed. She would cook holiday meals for parishioners who might not have family with whom to celebrate. She was known to keep the kitchen and washrooms of the church spotless, simply because she felt it was the right thing to do. When their daughter Constance (known as Connie), married at Church of the Ascension, Velma Braun demonstrated her powers of multitasking. She sewed not only the wedding dress for her daughter but also all of the dresses for the bride maids.

Around the time of his retirement, a group of parishioners made donations for the large stained-glass window, which is now found above the altar. It was then that the rood beam was moved so as not to block the beauty of the new window. In the summer of 1987, the church said goodbye to the Brauns when Rev. Braun retired. After retirement from Church of the Ascension, Rev. Braun served as interim director in Gates Mills, Ohio and Belleville, Ohio. Rev. Braun dedicated fifty years of service to the Episcopal church.

Velma passed away on September 18, 1996. Rev. Harold Braun died on April 8, 2002. They are buried in Fort Meigs Cemetery in Perrysburg, Ohio.

# A Legacy of Faith and Future: Celebrating 150 Years

Beloved People of God,

For 150 years Church of the Ascension has stood as a beacon of faith and community in Lakewood, Ohio, holding the distinct honor of being the oldest church of any denomination in our vibrant city. As we celebrate this remarkable sesquicentennial, we are launching a special **Legacy Campaign** to honor our past and secure our future.

Our goal is to raise \$150,000 to support vital projects that will enhance our worship, strengthen our ministries, and preserve our cherished campus for generations to come. A significant portion of these funds, \$90,000, is dedicated to a project close to the heart of many: the completion of our magnificent pipe organ.

Many of you know that when our organ underwent its extensive refurbishment in the early 2000s, funds ran short, leaving one crucial element unaddressed: the **16' pedal Violone**, which requires 73 new pipes. Imagine the profound richness and depth this addition will bring to our hymns, anthems, and special musical offerings!

The Legacy Campaign funds will also be used to address other pressing needs. We will **replace the roof on Strom Hall kitchen**, estimated to be \$30,000, ensuring the continued functionality and protection of this important space used to prepare community meals. Additionally, **we will add to our endowment for Facility Upkeep**, providing long-term financial stability for the ongoing maintenance and preservation of our historic buildings.

To acknowledge your generous support for this project, those who contribute a minimum of \$1,500 to the 150th Legacy Campaign will have their names inscribed on a plaque of honor within the church.

Your contribution of any amount to the Legacy Campaign is an investment in the enduring legacy of Church of the Ascension. It's a chance to honor the countless individuals who have built and sustained this parish for 150 years, and to ensure that our church continues to be a spiritual home, a vibrant community hub, and a cornerstone of Lakewood for the next 150 years and beyond.

# Introducing a new way to get your Contribution Statement and view the Church Directory via the IconCMO Member Portal

# What is IconCMO and How Does It Help Our Church?

IconCMO is a database that keeps financial records and member information for our Church. It facilitates the use of this database by Ascension's administrative staff to communicate with parishioners and maintain its financial records using a fund accounting methodology.

#### As a Church member, you can:

- review and edit your own information in the database.
- view and communicate with other church members an online church directory,
- view or print out your donation statement at any time,
- and see what groups you are in.

#### Our church staff can:

- edit or view any record based on their security level,
- add donations, pledges, members, groups, and attendance,
- review church accounting books or payroll,
- · communicate via mass email or text messaging to the entire church or certain groups,
- and more...

#### What Do I Need To Get Started?

Please request 'Member Access Credentials' (MAC) from the Church Administrator Jim Weiss Jim.Weiss@ascension-lakewood.org, the Treasurer Rincy Isaacs risaacs@ascension-lakewood.net, or Aaron Beatty aaron@ascension-lakewood.net. This is a required first step.

You will receive an email from the Church Administrator with a clickable link, and your username and temporary password. Please click on the link to login and change your password. You may be required to enter the Church's phone number; if so, type 216-521-8727. You may also change your username to one that you prefer instead of the assigned random number. Save these credentials for future use.

### **How Do I Access Icon With A Web Browser?**

Go to <u>Icon CMO</u> on your browser. You will need to enter the Church's phone number (216-521-8727) and your saved credentials.

# Can I Use My Mobile Device?

Yes! Our church members can have access to the church directory at their fingertips. Check out the church software app in the iOS App Store or Google's Play Store below or look up 'iconcmo' in the app store for your device.

# Can I See My Own Donations or Print Them?

Yes! No more waiting for donation statements to arrive via pony express mail for tax time. Our church members can print their statements right from the member portal. Our church members can verify that all their donations are recorded by the church instead of waiting until the end of the year. Please note that the donations via Vanco (Credit Card or Debit Card) are updated usually by the 7th of every month for the previous month.

#### What Else Can I Do?

The Member Portal helps church members in many ways to connect to the church and its members. Members are also able to update their own information (except for their picture). This leads to greater reliability of information as congregational members monitor their own profiles. Check out what is available below!

# Boar's head and Yule Log Festival
